#### WHAT IT IS

## A series of liturgical rites:

- ♦ "...to UNCOVER, then HEAL
  - all that is weak, defective, or sinful..."
- "...to BRING OUT, then STRENGTHEN
  - all that is upright, strong, and good."
- For self-searching and repentance and have a spiritual purpose
- ♦ RCIA, no. 141

## WHEN CELEBRATED

#### **During Lent:**

- On the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, the proper days
- ♦ For pastoral reasons on other Sundays of Lent
- Or on convenient days during the week
- RCIA, nos. 141, 146

#### Outside Lent for unusual circumstances and pastoral needs

- On Sundays or even on weekdays with the usual intervals
- ♦ Not on solemnities
- ♦ RCIA, no. 146
- ♦ Requires permission of the Diocesan Bishop
- RCIA, nos. 30, 34, 331

# PROGRESSIVE NATURE

- ♦ Elect instructed gradually about the mystery of sin
- Elect filled with Christ the Redeemer, who is

the living water,

the light of the world,

the resurrection and the life

♦ Elect progress in perception

of sin,

of desire for salvation

- ♦ RCIA, no. 143
- Therefore, three scrutinies are so necessary for the elect,

only the bishop can dispense

from one for a "serious obstacle",

or from two in "extraordinary circumstances"

• RCIA, no. 34.3

The elect but not the baptized candidates FOR WHOM There is no combined rite for use in the United States of America **MINISTERS** Presider is Priest or Deacon (outside Mass) Faithful also derive benefit and join in the intercessions for the elect RCIA, no. 145 **TEXTS** Always use the ritual Masses "I. For the Conferral of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation – 2. For the Celebration of the Scrutinies" Roman Missal, Third Edition: presidential prayers (collect, over the gifts, after communion) found in the Ritual Masses section special prefaces for the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent found in the Proper of Time section for each Sunday Lectionary for Mass, nos. 745-747 equal nos. 28, 31, 34 for Lent, Year A Always celebrate in the order given RCIA, no. 146 Note: Readings for the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, Year A may always be used in Year B and Year C even when the scrutinies are not celebrated ◆ LM, nos. 29B, 30C, 32B, 33C, 35B, 36C

## BASIC PREMISE

- ♦ Sin and evil are real; its power is strong
- ♦ Salvation is real;

Christ's power to save, protect, strengthen is stronger

- Sin, however, is only recognized in the light of grace
- ♦ Scrutinies ritually celebrate

the mystery of life, death, and resurrection.
